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MINUTES

Welcome

- 1) **Apologies** from G Brooks, Mrs E Carter, S Landale, T Marston, D Simmons, and from the PCSO were accepted.
- 2) **Declarations of interest** by the Councillors in any of the agenda items listed below.
 - a) EMB declared an interest in some of the planning applications.
- 3) Items of urgent business

4) Police matters

- a) Crime Report: Since the last meeting back in May the police have received 29 calls to the parish, of which 4 crimes were raised: 1 x Interference with a Motor Vehicle; 1 x Theft from Shop/Stalls; 1 x Malicious Communications; 1 x Criminal Damage.
 There have also been a number of suspicious circumstances calls in the North Norfolk area regarding cold callers claiming to be workmen and asking to look at boilers or read metres.
- b) Any other police business: problems with the travellers over the bank holiday weekend will be discussed in detail at the Travellers' meeting at the end of the month.
- 5) **Minutes of the Meeting** of 25 May (meeting on 6 July was cancelled) were approved and signed as a true record.
- 6) Matters arising not otherwise on the agenda

7) Report from the County Councillor

- Ongoing problems with the EE and Three relating to the **Cockthorpe Mobile Telephone mast** should be resolved in due course.
- Hazadous Waste Amnesty at Hempton on Saturday 17 and Sunday 18 September.
- Adults at Risk of Abuse: On a serious note the number of adults being abused does not abate so I am repeating the following advice: If someone you know is being abused call NCC Adult Social Services on 0344 800 8020 (24 hours a day); text 07767 647670; email SCCE@norfolk.gov.uk; online.norfolk.gov.uk/socialcareenquiry. Leaflets are available in the library. (You can also use these contacts if you are worried about a child). For more information see www.norfolk.gov.uk/speakup. In an emergency call the police on 999.
- Devolution for Norfolk and Suffolk: The briefest and simplest statement I can make is that Norfolk County Councillors across the political spectrum have given strong if cautious support to devolving powers and finance down from government but have no enthusiasm for setting up an additional tier of local government with a mayor. Whilst Norfolk has nearly 1 million residents the consultation for Norfolk and Suffolk achieved just under eleven thousand respondents. However I am confident that when NCC has its final debate on devolution councillors will give serious consideration to the outcome of the consultation together with views expressed at town and parish council meetings and by individuals across our urban and rural divisions. I am also confident that councillors, elected to represent the people of Norfolk will demonstrate due diligence before casting a vote on a mayoral combined authority for Norfolk and Suffolk.

The Parish Council decided that it was not in favour of Devolution. The Clerk was asked to send an email to NCCIIr M Strong to this effect.

A petition set up by a resident in Wells for **junction improvements** at Cherry Trees (to improve **traffic flow at the A148 and B1105** on the Fakenham by pass) was supported by Wells Town Council and the parishes on route (Walsingham included). The Town Council would formerly asked NCCIIr M Strong to take this to the County Council in order to get it on a long list for consideration.

8) Report from the District Councillor: not present

9) Highways

- a) Items to report
 - i) Potholes
 - (1) Sunk Road eastern end
 - (2) Bottom of Thursford Road (pill box)
 - ii) Resurfacing of St Peter's Road
 - **iii)** Follow up with highways engineer the damaged signs (directional sign to Walsingham on Fakenham by-pass and pedestrians on road sign on Fakenham Rd near turning to Slipper Chapel).
- b) Problems with verge-cutting were discussed. It was hoped that next year the County Council would be clearer about when the cutting would be done so that farmers would not do extra cuts just before the contractors were sent out.
- 10) Two **defibrillators** from AADEFIB (Andrew Deptford) have been installed at the Farms Shop and Gt Walsingham Barns (available 24/7).
 - a) The defibrillators have been registered with the East of England Ambulance Service. The cabinets and defibrillators should be checked on a regular basis (checklist provided). Cost covered by a grant. The code to access the defibrillator cabinets is C159X. However there is no need to remember this. In an emergency dial 999, once it is established that the patient is suffering from a heart attack (and that there is a third person available) the code will be issued. When the cabinet is open the defibrillator can be taken to the patient. The defibrillator provides clear spoken instructions (and diagrams) which are easy to follow (no training is required).
 - b) To consider organising a demonstration event with the EEAS possibly also with First Aid training. It was agreed that training would be great. It was suggested that Wells Cottage Hospital might be able to provide training.

11) Finances

a) To consider **request from News and Views for a donation** towards the production and delivery of the free community magazine. It was agreed to make a donation of £200 (as last year) and to ask for a copy of the accounts.

 - i) Brick Kiln Farm, Edgar Road ref: PF/16/0594: variation of condition 2 (approval plan) of planning permission PF/15/0921 to allow for revised design of dwelling including a first floor in part.

b) Applications since last meeting

- i) Internal & external alterations to facilitate conversion of former public house to ground floor retail unit and 2 first floor flats at Oxford Stores ref: PF/16/0667 and LA/16/0822. Plans circulated. Response emailed on 5 August: Walsingham Parish Council supports the application in general but has concerns about the access to the flats (directly onto the road) and the rear of the shop, as well as concerns for parking for the flats and for people using the shop.
- ii) Land to side of Edgar Road, Egmere ref: ADV/16/1155: installation of two site marketing boards. Plans circulated.

c) Applications since last meeting and decisions from NNDC

i) Proposed balanced cut and fill earthworks to construction winter storage reservoir at Field 500m south of St Edmund's Church, Egmere ref: NP/16/0688. Urgent response required so only circulated via email. Response submitted via email and copied to NNDCIIr and Historic England (East of England): Walsingham Parish Council objects to this application for the following reasons:

The reservoir would be immediately adjacent to a scheduled ancient monument of the medieval settlement of Egmere, and three listed buildings. The Scheduled Ancient Monument is on the Buildings at risk register. The inhabitant and owner of the two houses immediately adjacent to the reservoir had not been informed about reservoir until contacted by a member of the parish council. All other houses in the area are owned by Holkham Estate and are less likely to object to the application. The area of the site is very beautiful, remote and tranquil, and these significant attributes would be massively disturbed by the construction, existence and servicing of such a project.

The work of the development is irreversible.

No mention is made of the routes of underground piping away from the reservoir. No provision is made for an archaeological inspection of the site prior to or during work, even though the planned reservoir it is so close to a scheduled ancient monument. Please find attached a map of the area of the scheduled ancient monument, the scheduling record and list entry, and a photo of the site.

The Parish Council was concerned that the documents were not available to view on the website at the end of May despite the fact that application appears to have been registered on 18 May.

NNDC: Prior approval given.

ii) Conversion of the Pistol Club, Creake buildings into a residential dwelling with associated access, parking and landscaping ref: PF/16/0463. Plans circulated. No objection submitted 23 June 2016.

NNDC: Approved.

iii) Internal alterations to block up original doorway between the two bedrooms and re-position the original door at the new entrance to bedroom two at **3 Westgate** ref: LA/16/0664. Plans circulated. No objection emailed 5 Aug.

NNDC: Approved.

- iv) Creation of new windows and door opening at Foundry Farmhouse, Hindringham Road ref: PF/16/0789. Plans circulated. EMB declared an interest. Response emailed 5 Aug: Walsingham Parish Council has no objection to much of this application at Foundry Farmhouse. However concerns have been raised that in the installation of three windows in the west elevation with compromise a magnificent example of a Norfolk brick and flint wall. NNDC: Approved.
- v) Brick Kiln Farm, Edgar Road ref: PF/16/0773: erection of permanent agricultural dwelling. Plans circulated. No objection emailed 5 Aug. NNDC: Approved.

vi) External alterations to facilitate insertion of 4 roof lights to rear roof slope at **4 Knight St** ref: LA/16/0208. Plans circulated. Response emailed 5 Aug: concerned that the roof lights will spoil the roof line of this listed building and suggests that less obtrusive measures could be taken to address the problems.

NNDC: Approved.

vii) Single storey bungalow at **12 Cleaves Drive** ref: PO/16/0812. Plans circulated. No objection emailed on 5 August.

NNDC: Approved.

viii) Alteration to window opening to form new entrance with open sided porch at **12 Wells Cottages**, Wells Road, Egmere ref: PF/16/0913. Emailed support on 5 August. NNDC: **Approved**.

d) Decisions received from NNDC

- i) Stonegate, Egmere Road ref: LA/16/0473. Replacement of failed hard cement render with haired lime render and limewash finish to façade of Stonegate farm house, together with stabilisation and repair of stucco window surrounds. **Permission granted**.
- **ii) Abbey Farm**, Church Street ref: PF/16/0521. Erection of steel portal frame building over silage clamp to provide storage area for biomass woodchip for the biomass boiler located in Walsingham Abbey Grounds. **APPROVED**.

The Town Council has asked for support from the Parish Councils on the route. It was agreed that Walsingham Parish Council supported this request.
- **b) SAM2:** order has been placed with Westcotec. 50% of cost has been received from County Council Parish Partnership Scheme. To arrange installation and rota for regular moving of sign and recharging batteries.

16) Street Lighting

- **a)** Knight Street: street light unit broken: replacement required as well as the new bracket. To be installed shortly.
- b) New light and bracket required at Mount Pleasant (removed by UK Power networks when new poles installed): cost either £490 for LED replacement as other lights or £390 for similar. It was agreed to have the replacement at £390.
