 - High percentage of children in care, most kept within the county. Staff try to support families so that children stay out of care.
 - Environment Agency Flood alerts along the coast for tidal surge etc for Friday 13 January
 - · Co-op in Wells applying for permission for selling petrol
 - Roundabout at Cherry Tree junction on A148 at Fakenham is number 9 on a long list and £5,000 has been allocated for a feasibility study
 - Devolution was pulled when Kings Lynn and West Norfolk Borough Council joined other councils in Norfolk voting against the proposal.
 - Dementia Friendly Group in Wells is starting a dance group (contact 01953 713390)
 - · Still waiting for fibre broadband for Great Walsingham Barns
 - Mobile phone coverage will be improved by the end of the year but there will probably still be gaps. They will continue to work on the Minister.

8) Report from the District Councillor

- Big Society Awards are open for nominations e.g. unsung volunteers.
- Big Society Fund is open for applications (grants up to £15,000)
- 2nd homes funding of £2.4 million has been awarded to NNDC (second only to Cornwall
 which is a unitary authority) e.g. for Community Land Trust (providing affordable homes in
 perpetuity).
- Boundary Commission Review of District Council wards: Walsingham Ward: Wighton to go and Little Snoring to join.
- Online planning: new website to go live at end of January.
- Parapet peeled of grade 1 listed toilets in the High Street at the beginning of January. The
 Walsingham Estate and District Council worked quickly to make the site safe within two
 hours. Police attended but Highways did not. A second lot of scaffolding was erected and the
 loos have been re-opened particularly useful for visitors to the Abbey to the see the
 snowdrops. (Thanks to all those involved in clearing the site and making it safe.)

- East of England Local Government Association, as one of two net contributors, is lobbying for a better return from the Exchequer.
- Following the move of the CEO and two junior administrators to Gt Yarmouth, there has been restructuring at North Norfolk which works better and saves moneys.
