#### MINUTES

#### Welcome

- Apologies from G Brooks, Mrs E Carter, Mrs S Landale, Mrs K Richardson, County Councillor Dr M Strong, were accepted
- 2. Declarations of interest by the Councillors in any of the agenda items listed below.
  - a. EMB, NM and BL declared an interest in various planning applications listed below.
- 3. Items of urgent business
  - a. The Chairman reported that a new Vicar, Harry Williams would be installed by the Bp of Lynn on Monday 3 December at 7pm in St Mary's. All councillors would be invited.
- 4. Police matters
- Minutes of the Meeting of 23 May 2018 (meeting on 11 July was cancelled) to be approved and signed as a true record.
- Matters arising not otherwise on the agenda. None.
- 7. Report from the County Councillor sent via email.
- 8. Report from the District Councillor not present.
- Highways
  - a. Items to report
    - i. Pavement in Mount Pleasant
  - b. Other matters
    - i. In response to a request from Highways it was agreed that it would be preferable to keep the cobbles at the entrance to 26-32 Knight Street (rather than replacing with gold-chipped asphalt). It was suggested that access ramps could be used for the duration of the works which were expected to take five days (for the concrete to go off). The Clerk would liaise with Highways and the residents and staff of the Shrine.
    - ii. Bakehouse steps continue to be a hazard for pedestrians can the Parish Council take any further action to make it safer? It was decided that the Clerk should write to the owners pointing out that the steps are their property and they are therefore liable for damage / injuries and suggest that the steps are lit and / or protected by a hand rail / bollard.
- iii. **Trees on the embankment at Wells Road**. Response from Victory Housing Trust. We can confirm that we have a contract in place with a **tree surveying company** (Treewise Ltd.),... The majority of the trees you are referring to were last inspected in July 2014 and were given a very low risk rating, with no works specified. Treewise recommended that they are re-inspected in 2019... One of the trees (outside number



35) was last inspected in January 2017, at which time crown-shaping was recommended in order to avoid the street lighting column – the timescale specified for this work was 12-24 months and we have now placed an order with our tree surgeons (CGM Ltd.) to carry out this work.

Regarding the **footpath**, we have passed your comments on to the relevant surveyor in our Assets Team who deals with this type of work and requested that he arranges for an inspection to be carried out. If works are then

specified, an order will be placed with our current road/footpath repair contractor accordingly.

The only work we carry out to trees relates to safety – we have to target our limited funds towards the highest risk items, as directed by our specialist advisors. We do not carry out work to trees due to claims of light blocking or any other reasons some may perceive as nuisance caused by trees.

Regarding falling leaves, the collection of these is not a service we provide on a regular basis. Whilst we are carrying out our winter maintenance routines, we do collect fallen leaves, but as our winter maintenance only consists of one visit per site per annum, this is limited in scope. We do also collect leaves on an ad-hoc basis from sites where they may be causing a hazard and have indeed done this at Wells Road, to the steps, on a number of occasions.

All of our **grounds maintenance works** are funded by service charges to our tenants and we have to strike a balance between the service provided and the costs we can legitimately pass on. We therefore are not in a

position to carry out everything that everyone would like us to do.'

EMB and NM declared an interest. Response submitted on 13 August 2018: Walsingham Parish Council requests that the following serious matters of concern are addressed before permission is granted for this application.

#### **General Observations**

At the time of the proposed Anaerobic Digester and Solar Park the residents of Bunkers Hill expressed concern that these large scale developments would set a precedent for the further development of the site; this development appears to be the realisation of that fear. With each new development the nature of the residents' quality of life is eroded a little further. The residents' concerns are, if this development is approved, it will increase still further the likelihood of future large-scale development at Bunkers Hill particularly as a justification of the planning is that it "fits in well with the 'industrial' nature of the Egmere site" (TNS 1959 Design and Access Statement, p. 3). Much is made of the 'agricultural hub' but little mention is made of the residential community other than one reference to the Control Tower regarding noise (see below).

#### Specific Concerns

Noise: Confusingly the Design and Access Statement (p. 6) states that "it is not considered that a noise assessment is unnecessary", however, given that the Traffic Statement reveals that there will be lorry movements between 7am – 7pm seven days a week (during harvesting periods – 5 days a week otherwise) and that the plant will be refrigerated it seems somewhat remiss not to have a noise assessment. There is no reference to whether the plant is operated 24hrs a day – although what would seem certain is that the refrigeration plant will run all day (the main source of noise pollution?). The assertion that the "noise level would be unlikely to exceed 35dB at the nearest receptor 850m to the south at the Control Tower Bed & Breakfast" (Design and Access Statement, p. 6 [my italics]) is far from reassuring; indeed it would seem impossible to make an adequate assessment of the impact of the development on the local environment without an noise assessment being submitted in advance of any planning decision.

**Lighting:** Whilst it is understandable that lighting is required to ensure safe operating condition it would seem essential that a lighting plan is submitted. Previous practises by other developments in the area have illustrated the folly and impact upon light pollution of not having a lighting plan that can be enforced - knowledge of which is established in advance of a planning decision.

Archaeology: It would be refreshing if the archaeology report could actually develop an accurate picture of the historical basis of a site. Relying (and quoting) a sole internet reference which is far from accurate and misses out the most important elements of the airfield's history serves to undermine the historical importance of the site, leading the developer to be able to conclude that "the potential impact... will be limited to the time of the local airfield" (Design and Access Statement, p. 7) as if that is unimportant. Further, the report seems to overlook the fact that the nearest airfield site is not the technical site but the T2 Hangar close by and the fact the "farm track", as cited on the plans is actually the remains of 'runway number two'.

The Clerk was asked to re-enforce the concern about noise level and request that noise assessment should be submitted in advance of any planning decision. The maximum sound levels for this proposal are set at suitable levels as part of the conditions rather than decided once the facilities are built and in operation.

d. To consider a suggestion from a member of the public to convert the **telephone kiosk** in Great Walsingham to tourist kiosk / mini information point. It was agreed not to take up this suggestion as the kiosk is a listed building and still has a phone in it.

#### 14. Street Lighting

- a. Electrical Testing to be carried out by K&M Lighting (electrical test) 58 units £579.50 plus VAT.
- b. Changes to standing order following the renewal of the contract for a further 3 years (includes a 5% discount): was £67.08 per month now £71.48 (including VAT) per month were signed.

# 15. Airfield Memorial Project: Update from Nigel Morter

- a. Fundraising: another good month with steady beer sales (raised over £1500 since its launch) and organised fundraisers at the Carpenters Arms D-Day talk and jazz night £887.95; Carnvial Display £22; ABN have pledged £2500; Egmere Energy £250; Individual donations continue.
- b. Planning: Plans were submitted to North Norfolk District Council but on their advice later withdrawn due to insufficient information to make a decision. The fee has been carried over to the next submission which is hoped to be in October as it is taking sometime to collate the required information (detailed drawing s of sculpture, stand, display boards, Roll of Honour etc.). Once planning has been achieved we will ask for the conversion of pledges into donations and open-up a 'just giving' or other such internet-based donation page.
- c. Planned Events: Black Lion Hotel Remembrance Sunday 11th November 2018 Fundraising Auction Night and lighting the Beacon; Marble Hall – Holkham Hall; RAF North Creake History Talk – 10th April 2019 (tbc) Further detail to follow.
