10. SAM2

a. From 1 February 2022 to 19 February 2022 on Hindringham Road: 3,472 vehicles were recorded coming into the village with an average of 181 per day. The peak times of travel were 8 am to 9 am (average of 9 vehicles); and 5 pm and 6 pm (average of 8 vehicles). The maximum speed was 50 mph at 1:35 pm on 1 February, (although the average speeder was travelling just under 30 mph). The majority of vehicles were travelling below the speed limit which is 30 mph. The 85th percentile speed (i.e. of 2,951 vehicles) was 32.1 mph; and the average speed was 23.6 mph.
